## Safety Advice

### Attention

In some countries approval is needed to set up a marquee/tent larger than 75 m<sup>2</sup>. It is your responsibility to comply with local rules and regulations and to ensure that the marquee/tent is assembled correctly.

In case of bad weather conditions, it is your responsibility to ensure the marquee/tent is safely secured and that the marquee/tent does not cause damage to others.

Do not use open fire, welding equipment or other sources which can ignite, inside or close to the tent.

The marquee/tent must be safely secured. We recommend you secure your marquee/tent with straps and pegs as soon as it is assembled.

Make sure to check if the marquee/tent is covered by your home contents insurance.

Marquees/tents must be evacuated under extreme weather conditions.

In the event of snow always remove snow from the roof of the marquee/tent regularly to prevent snow from building on the roof as heavy snow can cause the marquee/tent to collapse.

In the event of rain there is a risk of rain puddles building up on top of the roof of the marquee/tent. Heavy rain puddles can cause the roof to collapse. It is your responsibility to ensure rain puddles do not build up. As a precaution, make sure the roof of the marquee/tent is stretched out properly and adequately over the side frames of the marquee/tent and remove rain water regularly.

Do not unpack or repack your marquee/tent in freezing temperatures. In case of temperatures below zero always unpack and repack your marquee/tent indoors to avoid the risk of cracking parts.

The marquee/tent must be totally dry before you repack and store it to avoid mildew.

Maintenance: You must regularly check and retighten all assembly points of your storage shelter or garage tent. It is especially important to retighten the roof cover 1 month after having erected your shelter or tent. The roof cover of your shelter or tent must always be tensioned to withstand wind and weather.

# ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

## Before you begin

Read all instruction before set up.

- Select all level site clear of rocks, branches, and other hard or sharp objects, to install your tent.

**⚠ WARNING: Keep clear of overhead power lines.**

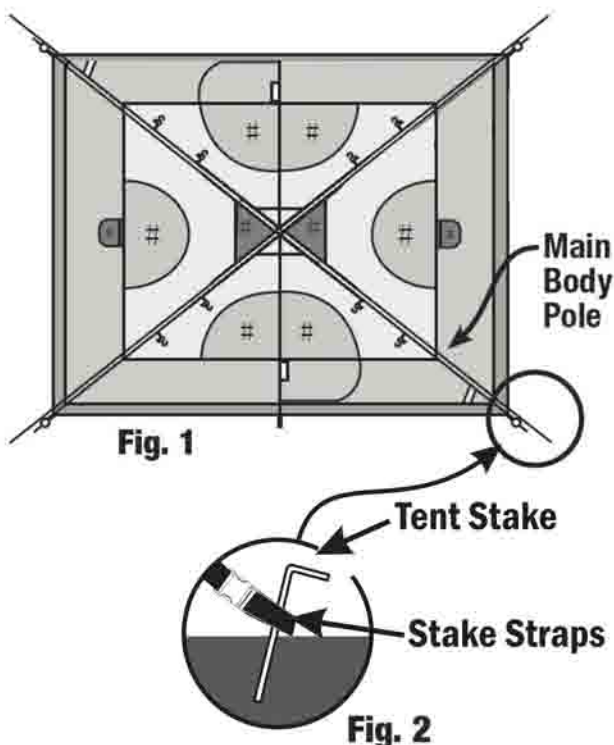
- Do not set up your tent under trees because of potential lightning strikes or falling tree limbs in inclement weather.
- Secure with all stakes and guylines provided to prevent property damage or personal injury.
- For best results in windy conditions, position narrow end of tent into the wind.

## Pole Descriptions

Description	Qty.
Main Body Pole (black, longest)	2
Rainfly Pole (red, short)	1

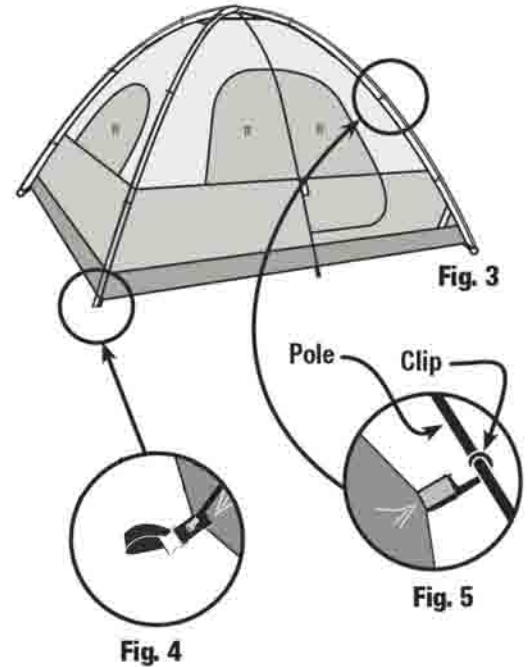
## 1 Layout & Positioning of Tent and Poles

- Layout and position the tent with door facing desired direction. (Fig. 1)
- Stake down tent corners first through the stake straps. (Fig. 2)
- Keep the floor taut.
- Stake down the remainder of the stake straps.
- Assemble all poles by unfolding and interlocking the shock-corded pole sections.



## 2 Connect Poles to Tent

- Insert end of pole into one pole ring. (Fig. 3 and 4)
- Go to opposite end of pole and carefully insert into pole ring. (Fig. 4)
- Repeat for all poles.



## 3 Attach Tent to body Poles Using Clips

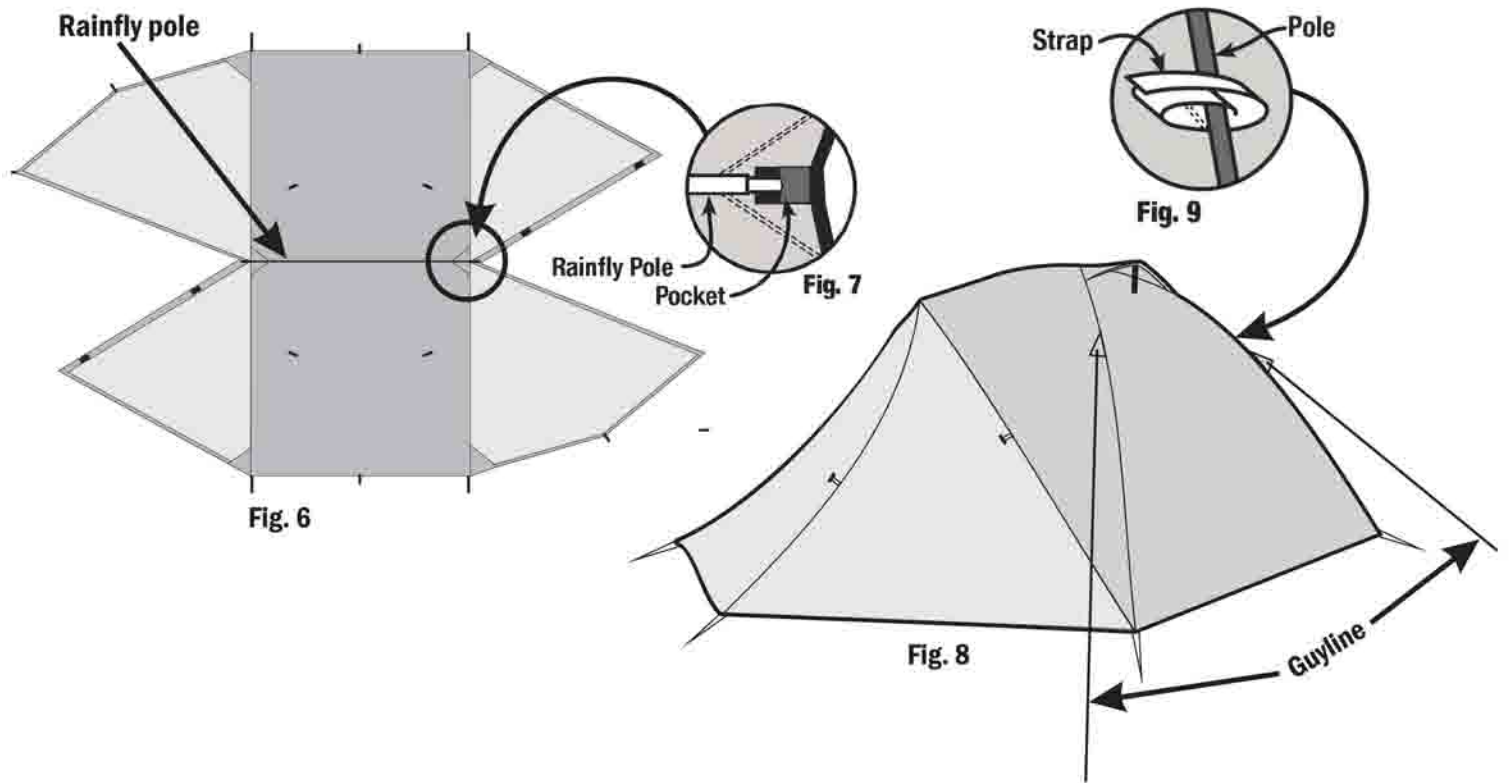
- Attach clips along the edges of tent to body. (Fig. 5)
- Make any adjustments to the tent stakes, if needed.

## 4 Attach Rainfly

- Attach rainfly pole to underside of rainfly with straps and insert the tips of the rainfly pole into the pockets on underside of rainfly. (Fig. 6 & 7)
- Drape rainfly over tent. (Fig. 8)
- Secure rainfly with straps located on the underside of rainfly. (Fig. 9)
- Attach and stake out guylines. (Fig. 8)

HINT: During setup, keep door zipped to keep proper tension on fabric.

## 5 To Store

1. All poles and stakes must be placed in the storage bag to prevent damage to the fabric items placed in the carry case.
2. Make sure tent is clean and dry before placing in carry case.
3. Remove rainfly, spread out on floor of tent, then unzip door & vents before taking tent down for storage.
4. Neatly fold tent to width of pole storage bag, place on tent, roll tightly, and place in carry case.
5. Store in a clean, dry area.

## Things You Should Know:

- Under certain conditions (cold weather, high humidity, etc.) condensation will form on the inside of your tent. Condensation is caused by water vapor from your breath, perspiration, or any wet clothing inside the tent. It is NOT LEAKAGE through the tent fabric. It can be minimized by removing wet clothing from your tent and by providing good ventilation through the tent.
- Tree limbs, tree sap, bird droppings, or moisture steadily dripping off tree limbs can cause damage to the tent fabric and its coating resulting in leaks.
- Never store tent, even for a short period of time, without drying it thoroughly and brushing off caked dirt. Do not pack stakes or poles inside your tent. Use a separate storage bag.
- Stake should be removed by pulling on the stake itself. NEVER PULL ON THE TENT TO REMOVE STAKES AS THIS COULD RESULT IN PROPERTY DAMAGE OR PERSONAL INJURY.
- Tent poles should not be left telescoped together during storage.
- Do not leave your tent set-up for weeks at a time. Be aware that exposure to ultraviolet rays from the sun can seriously damage material and/or cause it to become discolored.

**⚠ WARNING: Keep all flame and heat sources away from this tent fabric.**
